### A Word from the Chair

#### **MITZVAH GORERET MITZVAH!**

The Chairman's Word this month is the second part of our two-part series on Jewish Social Action Month. To remind you, the month was Cheshvan, following the High Holy Days, and named by KolDor for Social Action by virtue of its lack of traditional festivals (see <a href="https://www.cheshvan.org">www.cheshvan.org</a>).

The themes of the first two weeks were global poverty and trade & economic justice, and climate change. This month we take up the last two: Darfur, and Refugees and Asylum Seekers.

**Darfur** is covered in an LJ flyer you can find at <a href="http://tinyurl.com/32806a">http://tinyurl.com/32806a</a>. The text for the week is Leviticus 19:16: "Do not stand idly by while your neighbour's blood is being shed". Jewish support has been strong at the rallies to Protect Darfur, from marchers, rabbis, speakers and Jewish students.

Among the ideas in the flyer are these:

Make a donation to The World Jewish Relief Darfur Appeal, which supports elderly Darfuris and their dependents in five centres near the border with Chad. Details at: http://www.worldjewishrelief.org/darfur/

Write to your MP to urge that everything is done to ensure that the joint AU-UN peacekeeping force going into Darfur at the end of this year is strong enough to protect civilians. The UN is still waiting for countries to provide the necessary helicopters, trucks and other equipment. Also to urge that there is continued diplomatic pressure for safe, unfettered access for humanitarian organizations to all who need their help.

Rabbi Julia Neuberger, Liberal Judaism President, has suggested: we can befriend Darfuri refugees and asylum seekers in this country, and, in particular, help them if they are threatened with deportation back to Khartoum. We can tell our MPs how much we disagree with that return policy, but we should also make Darfuris feel they have friends here—and act on their behalf. If you are interested in reaching out to a Darfuri refugee and offering support and friendship, either through the community or as an individual, contact Nikki Levitan, Educational Outreach, Aegis Trust on nikkilevitan@hotmail.com or 07817 677 228.

It's the least we can do—after all, our community should know, if anyone does, what it means to be an asylum seeker or a refugee.

If you're planning to get T-shirts printed, get them made by the Streets Ahead Children's Centre (SACCA) in Rwanda. This project, supported by World Jewish Relief, has trained eight former street children in t-shirt printing and they are now finding contracts with VSO and the British Embassy. Contact cw@wjr.org.uk to find out more.

Help JCORE's **Dictionary Appeal**. Each year many unaccompanied asylum-seeking children come to the UK from countries such as Iraq and Afghanistan where wars and persecution have forced them to leave their families behind.

One of the biggest problems these children face is simply making themselves understood. With a shortage of schools in London, they often have to wait months before they can even start to learn English. A **dictionary** is a prized procession, often beyond their means. Please help JCore by making a donation to enable them to buy dictionaries and other schoolbooks. If you have revision books in good condition please donate them to JCore. #### **Hebrew Lessons**

For the past five weeks, five members of the community have been fortunate to study Hebrew with Yifat Haber. We've focused on the Hebrew of the siddur, working on vocabulary and grammar as we read a number of the common prayers closely.

We all learned a great deal and enjoyed the opportunity to spend time studying the texts that we normally read quickly in the services. If you would like to improve your Hebrew, learn more about the meanings of the prayers, or even to begin learning Hebrew, you are welcome.

Yifat will be in Israel over Chanukah, and is trying to arrange another set of lessons upon her return in February.

The proposal for the next course will be 4 weekly session beginning the first week of February, meeting two hours on one evening per week. Day and venue are still to be determined. There will be a small charge for the course.

### Herbed Parsnip-Sweet Potato Pancakes

Makes 18-20 pancakes

If you like your pancakes to hold together more firmly, add 2 tablespoons of flour to the batter

- 2 large parsnips (about 12 oz), peeled
- 2 medium sweet potatoes (about 12 oz), peeled
- 2-3 shallots, thinly sliced (about 2/3 cup)
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4 egg whites
- 1 1 /2 teaspoons chopped thyme
- 3/4 cup canola oil for frying

Accompaniments: Sour Cream or Crème Fraiche

Using a food processor or box grater, grate parsnips and sweet potatoes. In a large mixing bowl, combine parsnips, sweet potatoes, shallots, salt, egg whites, and thyme.

Heat oil in a heavy skillet over medium heat. Working in batches, spoon 1/4 cup batter at a time on to the skillet and press down with a fork to flatten. Fry for 2-3 minutes per side, until crisp and browned. Drain on paper towels and keep warm for up to one hour in a 200°F oven.

Serve with sour cream or crème fraiche.

### Letters to the Editor

Dear editor and cofaithful,

I am belatedly replying to G Allen's letter, which appeared in the September newsletter. My reason for delaying was that I had hoped that someone in our community might raise their head above the parapet and join this important debate. Since this has not happened, it falls to me to respond to G Allen's letter.

I am sorry if my description, perhaps overstated, of Israel's leadership, seemed intemperate. Unfortunately the debate about the issues in Israel/Palestine often is characterised by intemperance. Mr Allen's own letter compared the boycott of Israeli academics to the Nazi Germany's boycott of everything Jewish, culminating in Krystal Nacht! Please! We should reject the idea that Israeli and Jewish interests or policies are necessarily the same.

The campaign to boycott Israel is not anti-Jewish (even if some of its supporters may be). It aims to change Israeli policies which I believe Jews should also oppose—the perpetration of human rights abuses and cruel oppression of neighbouring peoples; for example, people in Gaza are now living as if under a mediaeval siege. A good Jew speaks out against such atrocities, especially when committed by the one nation-state which claims to be the Jewish Homeland. Home is where the heart is: surely no good Jewish heart could ever be in Israel while its leadership remains so inhuman and unJewish.
