An exhibition of tapestries, textiles and paperworks entitled "Unmarked Lives" will open at the Museum of Edinburgh in the Canongate on March 7th and run until May 3rd 2003. It is an international, solo, touring show of work by Joanne Soroka about the lives of her ancestors, who were Lithuanianand Ukrainian-born Jewish, as well as Scottish and Japanese, all immigrants to Canada. The work is abstract but tells the stories of ordinary people, representing their struggles, their emotions, their dreams. She says she is honouring all our ancestors, all those who are unknown and forgotten. "I am telling my own history", she says, "but also that of everyone else, the story which is the unwritten sum of human history. The theme is that we are all related. We are brothers and sisters."
