Kol Nidrei Appeal

We will be having a Kol Nidrei appeal and all money collected will go to charity. We haven't yet decided the "local" charity, but the other three are to be:

- Cosgrove Care, a Glasgow-based Jewish charity which supports adults and children with learning disabilities and mental health issues, within their own homes and the community

- Hadassah Medical Centre, the Jerusalembased hospital which has pioneered the development of health care standards and practices in Israel. It endeavours to forge links between peoples of all nationalities, races and religion who come to its doors for healing.

- World Jewish Aid, which acts on behalf of the UK Jewish community to provide emergency and development aid to those in need anywhere in the world regardless of race, religion or nationality. We will ask WJA to direct our contribution this year towards development projects, rather than disaster relief.

<u>Children</u>

We do not plan to have a crèche during any of the services. However, we will have some parents who will take turns to supervise the younger children with the aid of suitable activities. Children are welcome to attend any of the services, but we would ask that parents ensure that the dignity of the services is maintained. There is a service specifically for children at 4.30pm on Yom Kippur, to which children (and all adults) are invited.

Memorial Service

If you have a relative whose name you would like to be remembered in the memorial service on Yom Kippur, please let Nick Silk have details (Hebrew name, English name and relationship). It would be helpful if these details were given prior to Yom Kippur.

<u> Prayer Books</u>

The Liberal Judaism prayer book 'Machzor Ruach Chadash' will be used for all High Holyday services. Some of you will already have copies of the machzor. If you would like to purchase a copy before the High Holydays, please contact Nick. The cost of the books is £16.90. The Succoth and Simchat Torah services will use the 'usual' Liberal Judaism prayer book 'Siddur Lev Chadash'.

Building the Succah

We will be building and decorating the succah on Saturday 22nd October from 9am at Columcille; please bring along greenery and fruit. The service will start at 11am, and after the service we will have some 'nibbles' – hummus, cake and the like – together with fruit from the succah. Please bring a contribution! Help will also be required to dismantle the succah afterwards.

Simchat Torah

We are starting the service early this year, so as many children as possible will be able to attend. Please bring along as many you can, to minimise the number of sweets the kids can eat!!! As last year, children are encouraged to make flags and bring them along.
