Yom Kippur

Thanks very much to everyone who replied to the question about a Yom Kippur service in Edinburgh. Overall we had about a dozen positive responses, which was almost enough to persuade us to organise a service. The catch is that hardly anyone would have been present during the afternoon, in particular during Musaph, which is really the core of the Yom Kippur. We felt that we really need a sustained attendance during the day of at least half a dozen people (not necessarily the same people all the time) to give the right atmosphere of community prayer. Taking this together with the difficulty of getting a rabbi at such short notice, we decided not to proceed this year.

Speaking for myself, however, I think this was a useful exercise. Last year, at our AGM, we discussed this question of High Holy Day services and decided against trying to hold them, so asking this question was a way of finding out whether we had changed our minds about it. Based on the response, my feeling is that we are indeed changing our minds about it and when we come to reconsider in January, we may well find that the community has built up the commitment that would be needed to successfully hold a service next year (*L'shana haba'ah b'Edinburgh*!)
