Open Day

On Saturday 17 March 2001 at the Eric Liddell Centre, Morningside Road, the Edinburgh Reform Jewish Community held it's second 'open' day. It was attended by around 34 people who came in over the course of the day for the Shabbat service, lunch and study (and some for all three!). There were eight new visitors who were not part of the usual congregation which amounts to nearly a quarter of the total attendance.
