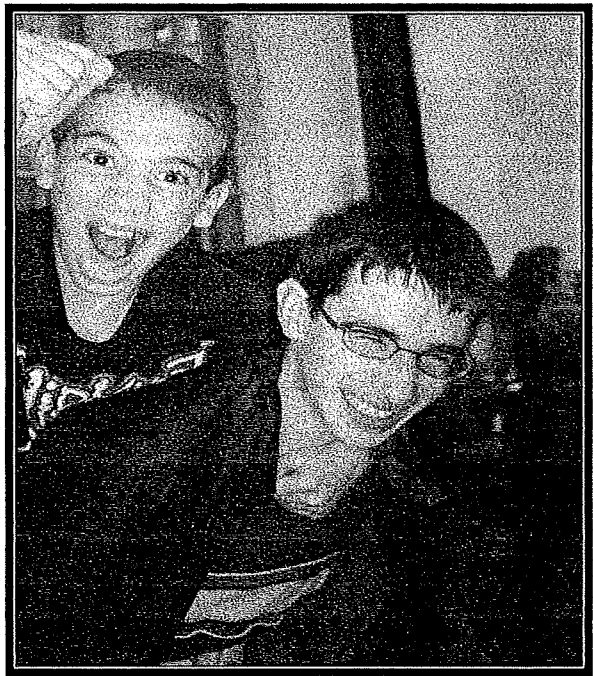

Edinburgh Reform Community

Honey Cake (makes 2 cakes)

Ingredients:

14 oz plain flour
6 oz firmly packed dark brown sugar
1 tablespoon baking powder
1 teaspoon baking soda
2 teaspoons cinnamon
½ teaspoon each ground allspice, nutmeg, ginger and salt
4 eggs
20 fl oz honey
8 fl oz strong black coffee
4 tablespoons vegetable oil or melted butter
7 oz coarsely chopped nuts

Method:

Preheat oven to gas mark 4, 350°F, 175°C.
Grease and flour two 22x12cm loaf tins.

Stir all dry ingredients together until well-combined. Make a well in the centre of the mixture and add eggs, honey, coffee and oil.

Stir mixture until smooth. Split the mixture in half and place into 2 tins.

Bake in oven for about 1 hour or until a toothpick inserted into the middle comes out clean.

Cool for 10 minutes before removing from tin, then leave to cool further on a wire rack.
